# **SEASONS FOR GROWTH**

Change and loss are issues that affect all of us at some stage in our lives. At Thornlie Primary School we recognise that when changes occur in families through death, separation, divorce or related circumstances, young people may benefit from learning how to manage these changes effectively. We are therefore offering a very successful education program called Seasons for Growth. This program is facilitated in small groups and is based on research that highlights the importance of social support and the need to practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. It focuses on developing strengths in areas such as self-esteem, managing feelings, problem-solving, decision-making, communication and building support networks. Seasons for Growth is not counselling. It is an education program that uses a wide range of creative activities to learn how to manage well in times of change.


Seasons for Growth has been timetabled to run for 8 weeks for approximately 45 minutes each week. The program will conclude with a Celebration session.

What's Happening in Room 6?



The students in Room 6 constructed their own toys out of recycled materials during Design and Technology. They came up with some amazing creations and put in lots of effort!

We have also been learning about the meaning and importance of NAIDOC week and created beautiful artwork to be displayed for the NAIDOC assembly! We examined the art produced by Jade Dolman, a local Aboriginal artist. The students utilised Aboriginal symbols to tell a story through their work. They reflected on their family and created a meeting circle, with their family members seated around it, demonstrating the bond among them. The lines leading out of the circles signifies that there is always a path back to one's family or home.





# **Chocolate Parenting**

Do you turn to chocolate when stressed? Or do you use other coping strategies?

This workshop runs over two parts and is for parents and carers who would like to learn more about stress and effective strategies for dealing with it.

The first session will focus mainly on identifying internal and external stress, and how we cope with it. This session will end by introducing Values; and identifying what is most important to us.

The second session will delve into effective skills to deal with stress. Skills will be taught and practiced in the session that help to deal with unhelpful thoughts, feelings and memories. The session will conclude with a return to Values and setting goals.



It is about keeping information safe and secure, but also about behaving responsibly and being respectful of other people online. We need to think about Cyber Safety when using websites, apps, online games, social media sites or any time we are using a device such

# What Can I Do To Stay Safe Online?

Below are some tips on how to stay safe when using technology or the Internet:

- · Always ask for permission before signing up for any channels or playing digital games.
- Set strong passwords for all your accounts ever share these with friends.
- · Activate privacy settings and only friend people
- who you already know and trust.

  Do not post any content that gives out too much information about you (such as your address, phone number or the name of your school).
- Check laws and guidelines relating to games, apps and websites that you use.
- Use good judgement when exploring websites outside of school.
- · Never post a photo or video of your friends without their permission

If anything you see online makes you feel uncomfortable, worried, sad, or unsure, leave the site and talk to a trusted adult



# What is the purpose of a School Board?



# STUDENT HEALTH



How to wash your hand

overnment of Western Australia partment of Health

During a change of season we often see an increase in student absence due to respiratory (colds/flu) and gastroenteritis infections. Whilst it is often difficult to prevent transmission, every effort should be made to minimise the spread of infection. The WA Department of Health Communicable Disease Guidelines outline the following best practices:

- Students/Staff should stay home in the early stages of illness as at this stage they can be infectious and shed the virus, bacteria or parasite through coughing, sneezing, contaminating surfaces and personal contact.
- Students/Staff who have had gastroenteritis should not return to school until they have been symptom free for at least 24 hours.
- Parents should seek medical advice if their child has ongoing symptoms of illness.

To minimise the spread of viruses, children should be encouraged to cover their coughs and sneezes with tissue and blow their nose regularly. Tissues should be disposed of properly and hands washed regularly.

Absences from school need to be explained. This can be achieved by sending a note with the student upon their return to school, contacting the office on 9232 3450, sending a text message (SMS to 0437 881 842) or replying to the automated SMS message sent to your phone if your child is absent.
