

Living with change and loss


Change and loss are issues that affect all of us at some stage in our lives. At Thornlie Primary School we recognise that when changes occur in families through death, separation, divorce and related circumstances, young people may benefit from learning how to manage these changes effectively. We are therefore offering a very successful education program called Seasons for Growth which will commence in this term. This program is facilitated in small groups and is based on research which highlights the importance of social support and the need to practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. The program focuses on issues such as self-esteem, managing feelings, problemsolving, decision-making, effective communication and support networks.

If you think your child would benefit from Seasons for Growth we would encourage you to talk to him/her about participating in the program.

Thornlie Primary School is pleased to be offering this important program through the Chaplaincy Service and we are confident that it will be a valuable learning experience for those who request to be involved. All schools are required to complete the AEDC in Term 2, 2024.


The AEDC gives us a complete picture of how children have developed by the time they start school. The data is used by schools, communities, and governments to plan services and supports that give our kids the best start in life.


Step 4 Register your children
