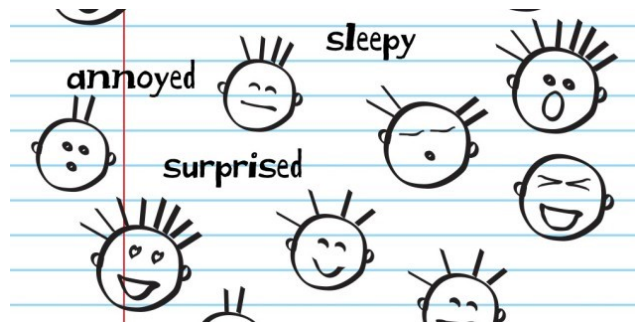

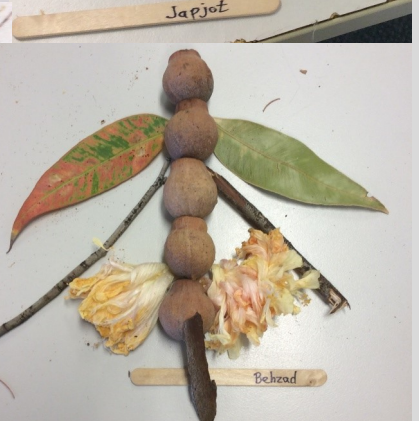

Physical Education Program 2023

New Initiatives

In Semester 2, 2022, our newly appointed Physical Education teacher Mr Mosey, conducted a full review of the Physical Education learning area at our school. The review involved; an audit of the school's Physical Education resources, recess and lunch physical education activities, extra-curricular clubs, incursion and excursion schedules, interschool competitions and the range of games students had access to. The review provided Mr Mosey with a clearer understanding of what was being provided in Physical Education and where we could provide more opportunities for more students. In 2023, Mr Mosey presented to the teaching staff and school board new initiatives for the Physical Education program and these initiatives were unanimously supported by the teaching staff and school board. The new initiatives are as follows:

Term 1:

Field Hockey Sporting Schools program (Years 3-6)
Softball Sporting Schools program (Years 3-6)
Badminton Club & Hockey Club (Lunch activities 20 per term)

Term 2:

Netball NetSetGo Coaching Program coach led incursions (6-week program)
Year 5 & 6 Netball Faction Carnival
Soccer Club (Years 1-6)
Gymnastics Sporting Schools program
Volleyball Club (lunch activities 20 per term)

Term 3:

Athletics Club (extra-curricular 8:00 am – 8:30 am)
Athletics Faction Carnival
AFL Sporting Schools Program coach led incursion

Term 4:

Stay n Play (extra-curricular parent and child events)
Sporting Schools Tennis Program
Lynwood Super 7s Soccer Carnival
Tennis Club (lunch activities 20 per term)



So far, our school has obtained over \$6000 worth of new sporting equipment by participating in these new initiatives e.g. NetSetGo, Field Hockey Sporting School program. The core purpose behind these changes is to provide a wider range of sporting opportunities for more students within the school while also providing the students with high quality physical education equipment. These new initiatives will serve as a replacement for the membership with the Southern River Sports Association and the associated interschool carnivals that our school used to be involved in.

Screenshot the harmful content, webpage address (URL), account username.

Report
Report to the online service - if they don't respond within 48 hours, report to [esafety.gov.au](https://www.esafety.gov.au).



3

Prevent further contact
Use settings to ignore, mute or block the other person and check your privacy settings.



4

Get more help
Talk to a trusted adult or a counsellor about the impact.

If you need to talk to someone, visit [kidshelpline.com.au](https://www.kidshelpline.com.au) or call them on 1800 55 1800, 24 hours a day 7 days a week.

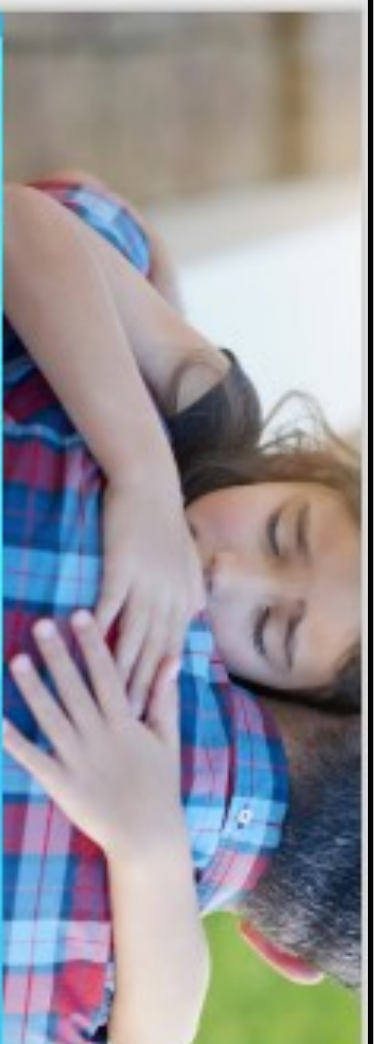
