RAPID ANTIGEN TESTS AVAILABLE

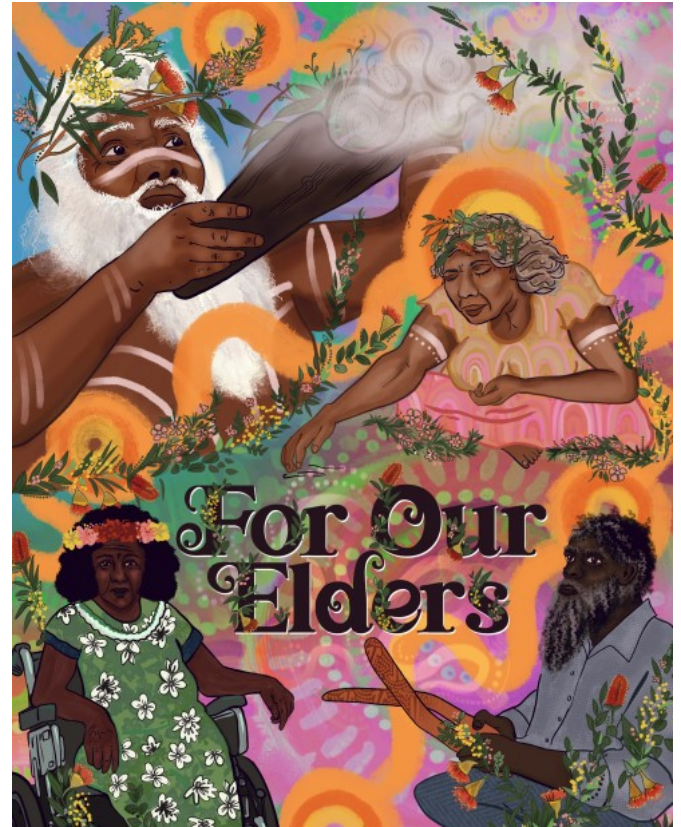
The Department of Education has provided more rapid antigen tests to schools for staff and school community families. Please see the main office staff to pick up your allocation of these.

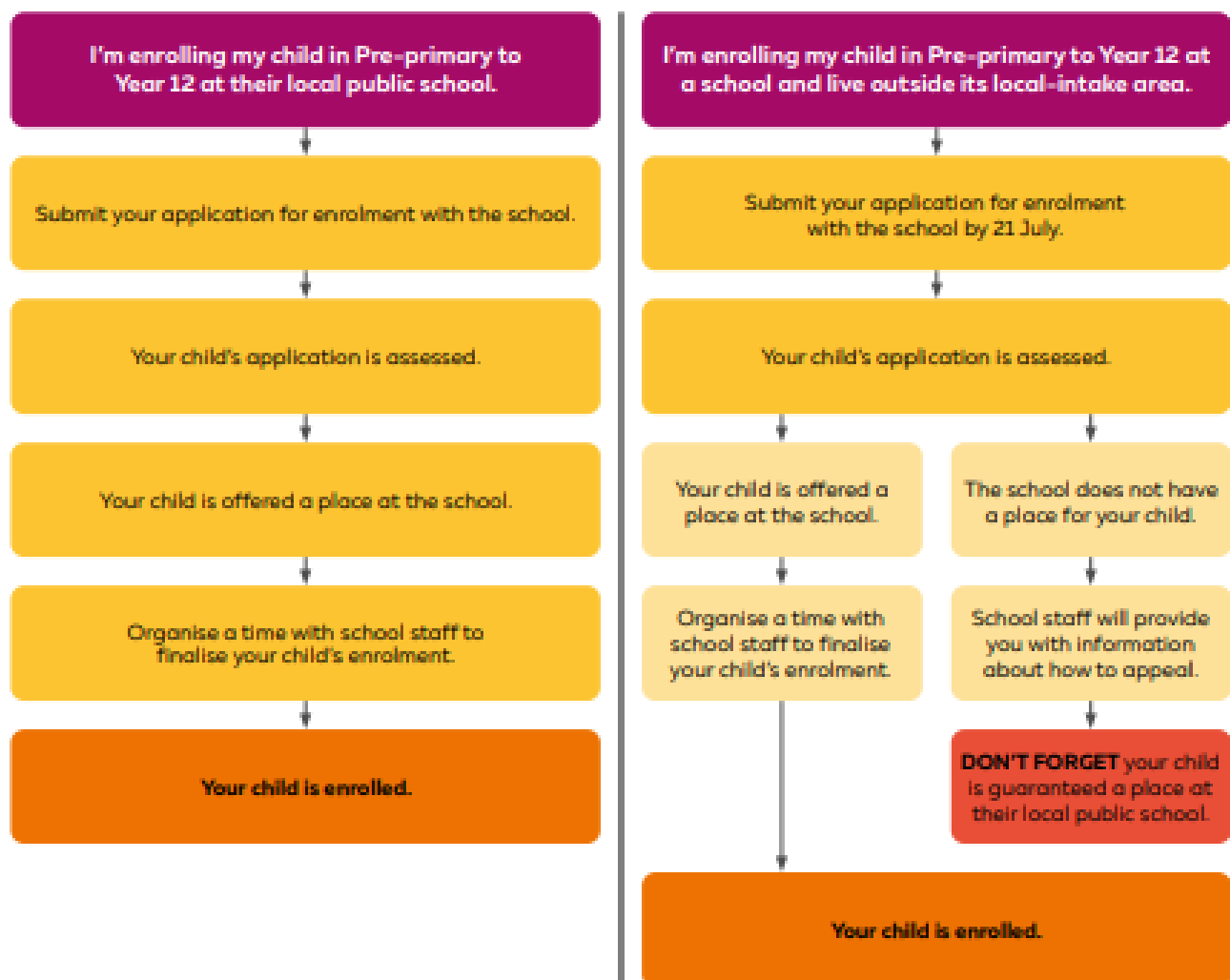

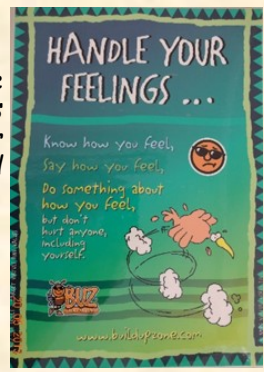
Thornlie Primary School is a BUZ school!

- * Provide a broad range of experience, advice and expertise to the Principal, and participate in key decisions as listed below in the policy making, enforcing and reporting of the school.
