The selected schools will then participate in a transition program in Term 4 in readiness to start the 2019 school year as Independent Public Schools.

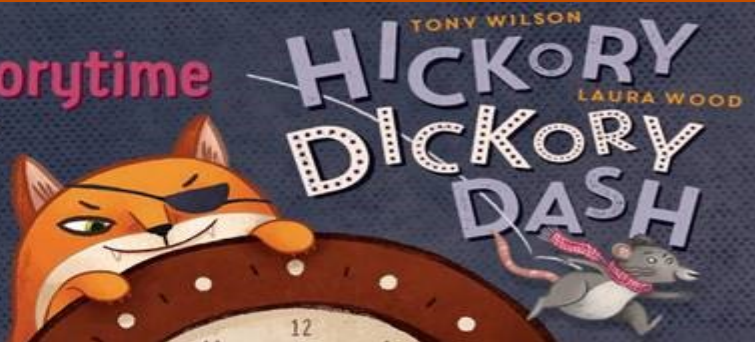

National Simultaneous Storytime (NSS) is held annually by the Australian Library and Information Association (ALIA). Every year a picture book, written and illustrated by an Australian author and illustrator, is read simultaneously in libraries, schools and many other places around the country. Now in its 18th successful year, it is a colourful, vibrant, fun event that aims to promote the value of reading and literacy, using an Australian children's book that explores age-appropriate themes, and addresses key learning areas of the National Curriculum for Foundation to Year 6.

At Thornlie Primary School, the Literacy Committee hosted this year's National Simultaneous Story Time on Wednesday 23 May 2018, with all Mainstream students participating in this fun event. All of the teachers wore mouse ears and Ms Pettit shared this year's book, ***Hickory Dickory Dash***, written by Tony Wilson and illustrated by Laura Wood. Classes then participated in follow up learning activities with their classroom teachers.

On Tuesday Room 10 went to Naturescape as part of our Environment Unit of work.

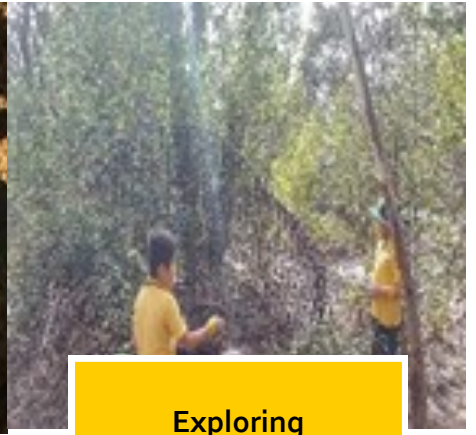

Bush Art

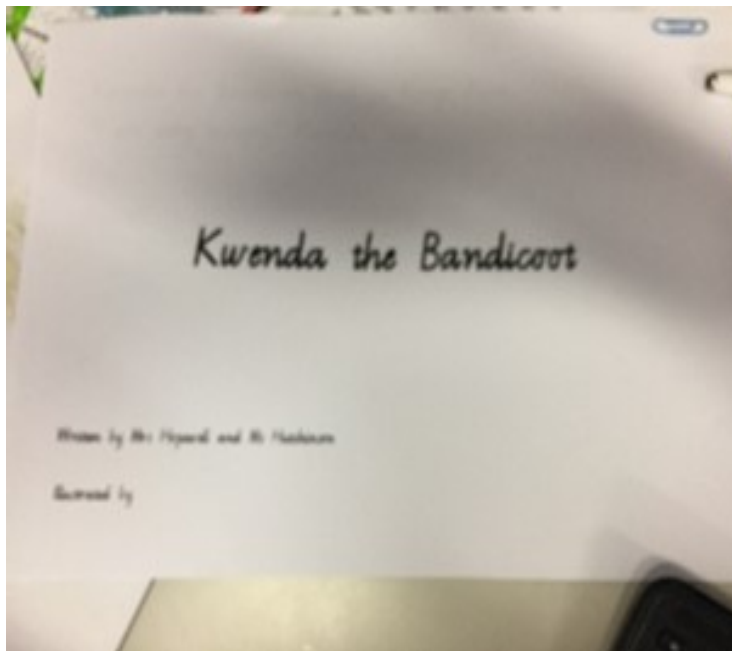


One of the Animals that lives in Kings Park



Exploring

We have made a narrative using some of these animals as characters and use the strategy of Talk For Writing to explore a narrative and all the language related to this topic.



Children will imitate the text, work with the text, with the intention of them writing their own narrative set in Kings Park.

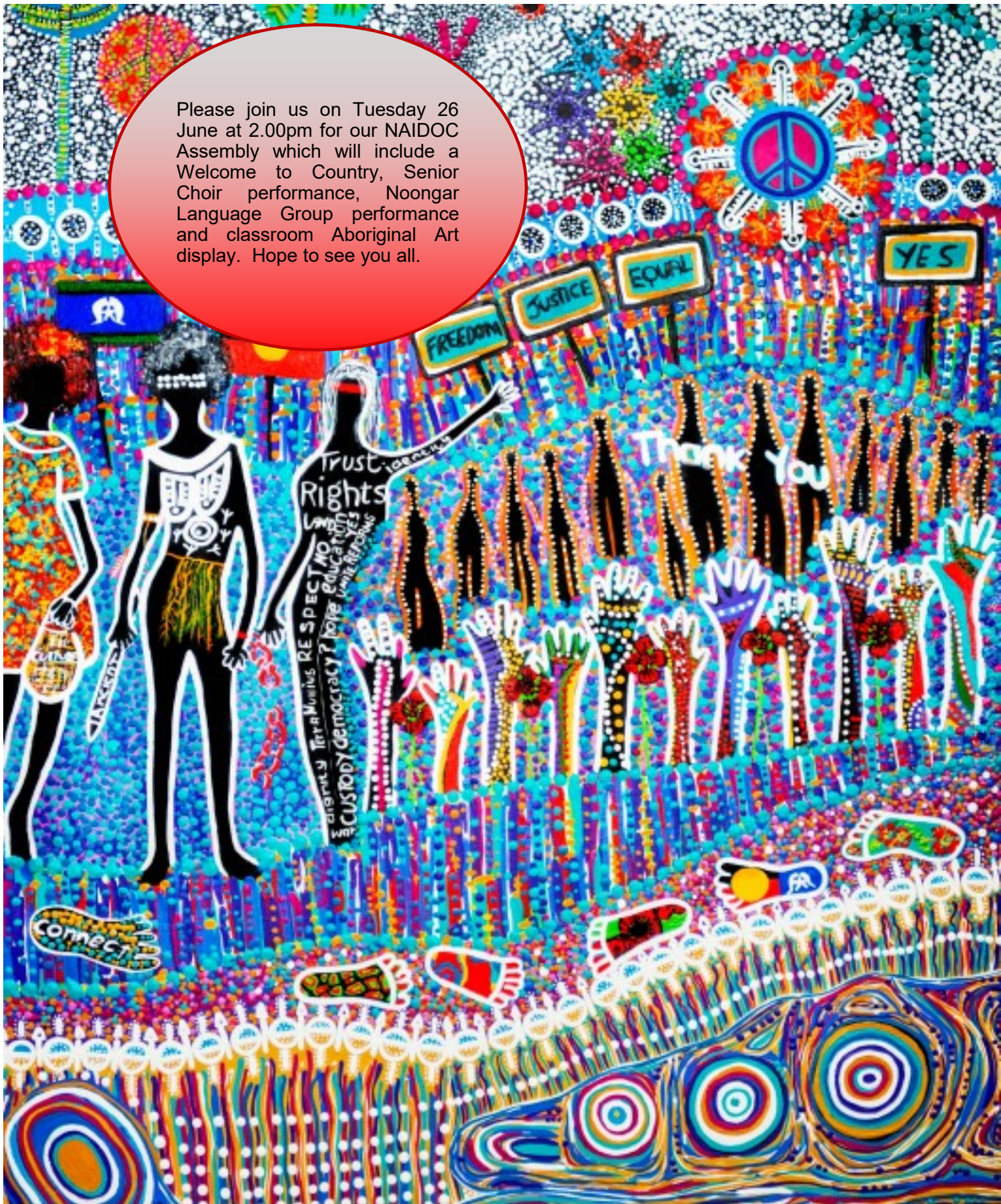

Child care fee assistance is changing

From July 2018, three things will determine how much subsidy the Government will contribute to your child care fees.

From 2 July 2018, the child care fee assistance your family receives will change, your information does not automatically rollover to the new system and you may not receive any subsidy if your assessment is not completed.

COMMUNITY HEALTH HEAD LICE

Head Lice are tiny insect parasites that live on your head and feed on your scalp. Head lice are spread by head-to-head contact with another person who has head lice. This kind of contact includes doing group work, playing, or hugging.

Tips for preventing head lice

- Check your child's hair regularly for head lice and eggs ('nits'). Use a metal fine tooth 'nit' comb and plenty of hair conditioner applied to the dry hair, to make the task easier and more effective. To help children sit still for this, offer distracting activities, e.g play a favourite video, provide games, ipad apps, offer a head massage.
- Tie long hair back. Braid long hair and /or put it up if possible.
- Consider applying hair gel or mousse. These do not prevent or repel lice but may help to keep stray hair strands from contact with other heads.
- Avoid sharing combs or brushes.
- Remind your child to avoid head-to-head contact with other children, e.g when working at the computer with others, or when playing, or hugging.
