Dear Parents/Carers

It's been a busy couple of weeks with NAPLAN testing last week and NAPLAN catch up this week for Year 3 and 5 students. Staff who coordinated the NAPLAN testing at our school reported that the testing went smoothly.

Students from Pre-primary to Year 6 attended the Science Eco Incursion in Week 3 which provided students with the opportunity to view some amazing creatures! From the look on students' faces, it was certainly a wonderous experience for them.

STUDENTS' RAT KITS HAVE ARRIVED

The RAT kits delivered to the school last Friday are being distributed this week, to parents of students from Kindy to Year 6. Included in this newsletter is a letter from the Health Department regarding the use of the kits. Information about the distribution of the kits is as follows:

- Students in Kindy Green and Pre-primary Students: RATs were distributed on Tuesday 17 May.
- * Students in Years 1/2 and 3/4: RATS will be handed to parents Wednesday 18 May 2:30 – 3:30pm in the old undercover area.
- Students in Years 5 / 6: RATS will be handed to parents on Thursday 19 May 2:30 – 3:30pm in the old undercover area.
- Students in Kindy Yellow: RATs will be <u>handed to</u> parents at drop off (8:30 – 9:00am) on Friday 20 May.

NB: RAT kits cannot be given to students to take home. Parents/carers are required to sign for the RAT kit when they collect them. Parents who missed their collection day, please see the front office staff from 3:00pm on Friday 20 May.

If your child becomes symptomatic they should stay home and be tested for COVID-19. Please notify the school if your child tests positive for COVID-19. Thank you for your continued efforts in keeping our school safe!

PARENT & CARER SURVEY

Applying to enrol your child Kindergarten

Enrolment application process

Once you submit your child's application for enrolment, it will be assessed by the school's principal. In some cases, the school may receive more applications than places available. When this happens, the principal prioritises applications.



First priority

- You and your child live in the school's local-intake area.
- They have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- You live nearest to the school.

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Second priority

- You and your child live in the school's local-intake area.
- They do not have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- You live nearest to the school.



Third priority

- You and your child live outside the local-intake area.
- They have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- You live nearest to the school.



Fourth priority

- You and your child live outside the local-intake area.
- They do not have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- You live nearest to the school.

If your child's school doesn't have a local-intake area, the principal will prioritise applications from those that live nearest to the school to those living furthest from the school.

Why do I need to apply by the 22 July?

Applications submitted by the deadline form part of the school's first round offers. You can still apply after 22 July, but this may mean that your child misses out on a place.

If your child is not offered a place, the school staff will help you find another school as close to your home as possible.

What do I need to have to apply to enrol my child?

- Your child's birth certificate or identity documents.
- Proof of your child's residential address.
- If your child was born outside Australia or is a temporary resident of Australia, you need their passport, visa and travel documents.
- You need to tell the school whether your child has an Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) immunisation history statement.

Don't have all these documents right now?

Provide as much information as you can. You should make a time to speak with school staff to let them know what is missing and why you don't have it.

Don't forget. You will need your child's current Australian Immunisation Register Immunisation History Statement if your child is offered a place.

How long does it take?

Contact your child's school if you would like an update on their application.



FREE RAPID ANTIGEN TESTS

WA Premier Mark McGowan recently announced the State Government's expansion of its free rapid antigen test (RAT) program, including provision of more than 10 million free RATs to school students to enable families access to RATs so they can test their children, if required.

A rapid antigen test is a quick home test to check if you have COVID-19 and provides a result within 15 to 30 minutes.

RATs can be used to test household members who are close contacts or have symptoms, including a fever of more than 37.5°C, acute respiratory symptoms (including cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, runny nose, acute loss of smell or taste) or non-specific symptoms (including fatigue, headache, diarrhoea or nausea/vomiting).

Anyone with symptoms should be tested for COVID-19 and if negative, stay home until symptoms clear. Find out what to do if a household member tests positive for COVID-19 or is a close contact as part of the testing and isolation process. Check the WA Government website - <u>COVID-19 Coronavirus: What to do if you have COVID-19 or are a close contact</u> (www.wa.gov.au).

Most RAT kits have a QR code that links to a video that shows how to take the test – whether it is a saliva test or nasal swab. Kits also include guidance on their recommended use.

Check the suitability of the free RATs provided for young children and follow instructions closely. Parents or guardians should perform or supervise RATs on children.


